23<sup>nD</sup> and 24<sup>TH</sup> April 2010, Institut für Philosophie, Berlin. An international symposium hosted by SFB 447 'Kulturen des Performativen', Freie Universität Berlin in association with the 'Performance and Philosophy Working Group' of Performance Studies international.

In what sense does performance *do* philosophy, rather than merely illustrate it? In what sense does philosophy *do* performance, rather than merely theorise it?

'Performance and Philosophy' seeks to explore the relationship between the performing arts, performativity and philosophy in the light of both the theatrical tradition in Western philosophy (Plato, Nietzsche, Kierkegaard) and what can be seen as a recent 'theatrical turn' in philosophy (Cixous, Lyotard, Deleuze), as well as the 'philosophical turn' in theatre and performance that can be traced back to such figures as Artaud and Stanislavski.

As the final conference of the philosophy project B9 at SFB 'Kulturen des Performativen' and the second interconference meeting of the PSi 'Performance and Philosophy Working Group', the symposium also seeks to explore different approaches to the very concepts of performance and performativity, by bringing together some of the key thinkers who have done significant work to demonstrate the productivity of the conjunction between performance and philosophy.
